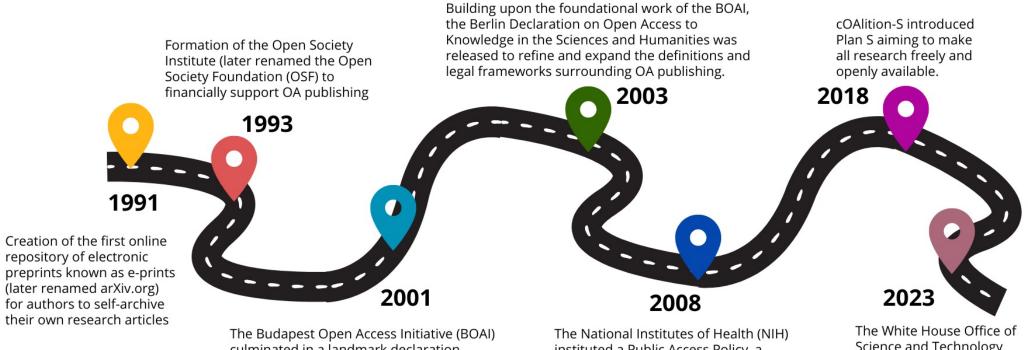

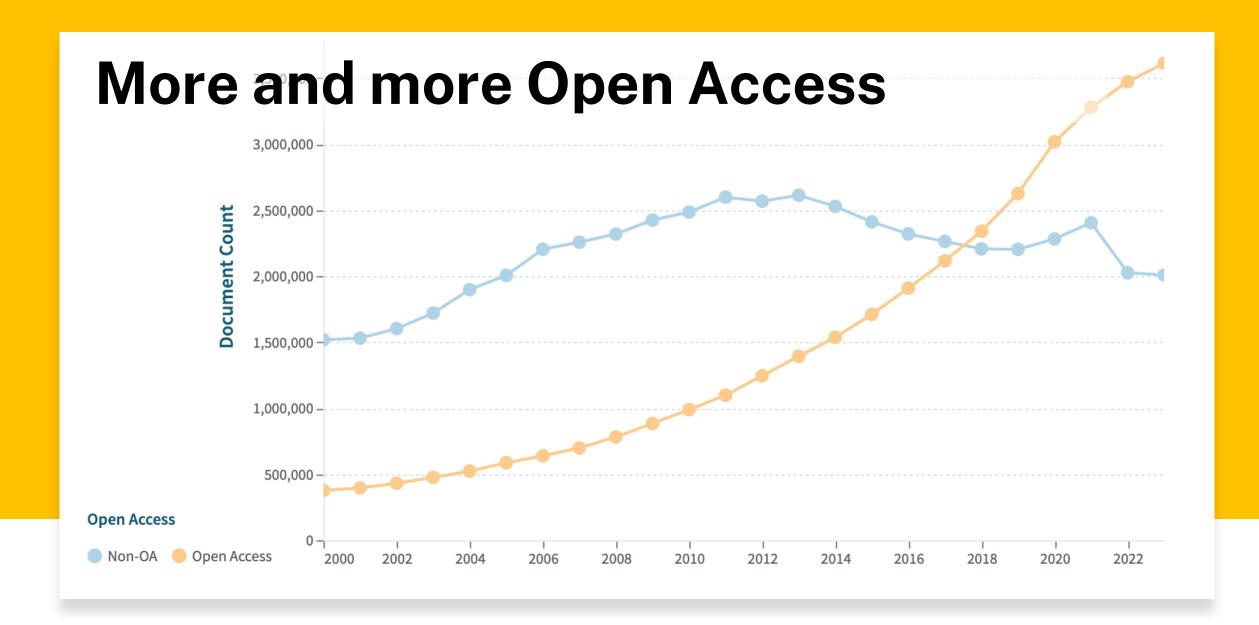
Driving for Open Access

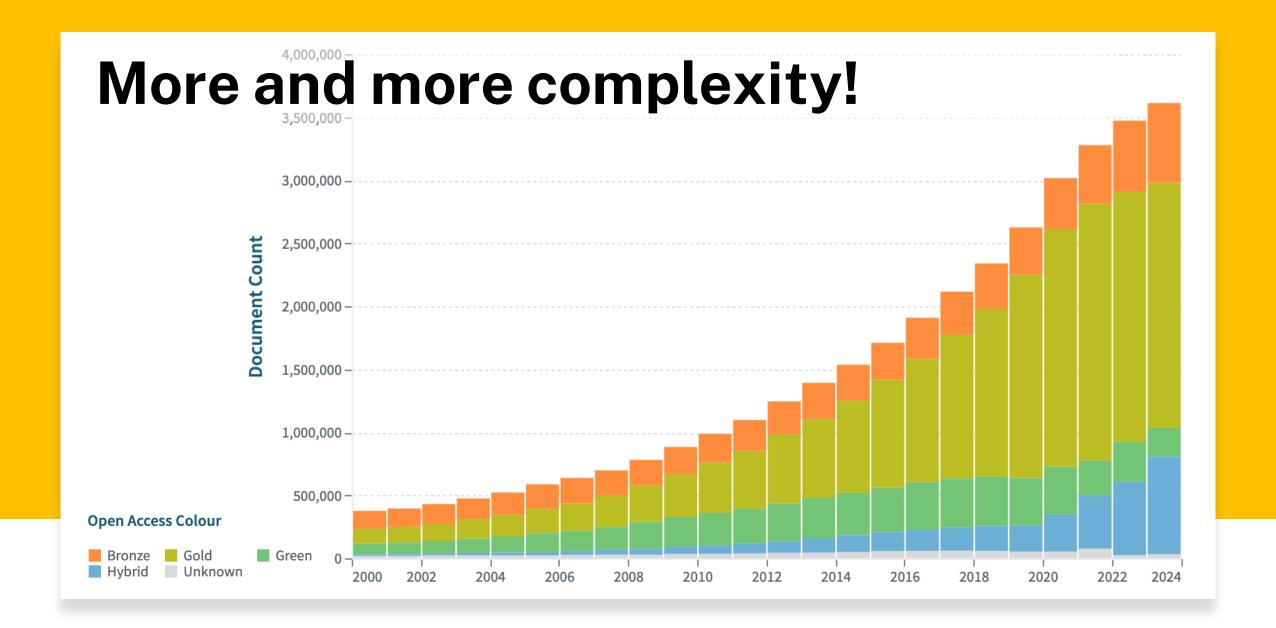


culminated in a landmark declaration advocating unrestricted, free access to scholarly literature. This initiative introduced and popularized the term "open access" to describe the concept of enabling free availability of academic publications.

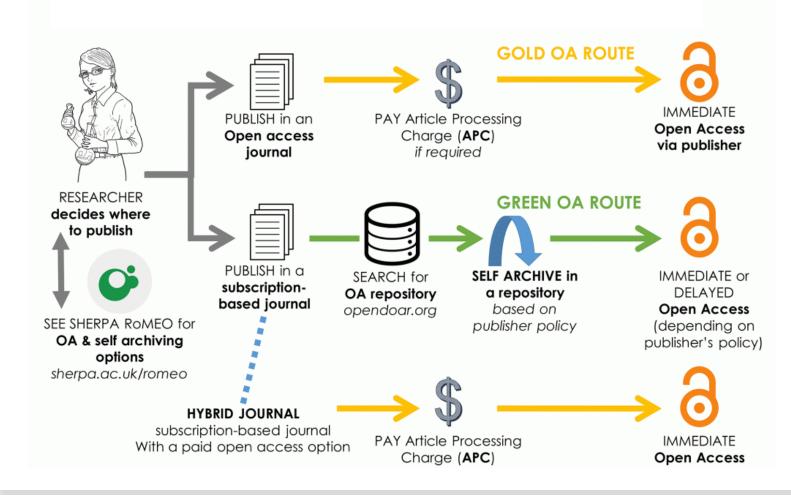
The National Institutes of Health (NIH) instituted a Public Access Policy, a mandate stipulating that research publications arising from NIH-funded projects must be made freely accessible to the public through PubMed Central within a year of their publication date.

The White House Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP) declared 2023 as the Year of Open Science
